THE IMPACT OF URBAN SPRawl DEVELOPMENT ON AGRICULTURAL LAND USE IN ONDO STATE, NIGERIA

This study determined and analyzed the causes as well as the spatial pattern of urban sprawl development and its associated impacts on the agricultural lands in Ondo town. Multistage sampling technique was employed to administer a total number of two hundred and thirty-four (234) questionnaires to residents. Descriptive statistics was used to summarize nominal variables while Likert scale was employed to examine perception of residents on characteristics, causes of urban sprawl development as well as factors responsible for encroachment into the surrounding agricultural lands. The Spatial pattern of urban sprawl development was determined using satellite imageries acquired through ArcGIS 9.3, Idrisilva 17.0 softwares. The result reveals that the major characteristics of urban sprawl are encroachment of agricultural lands (GCI 3.34), residential development beyond the city boundary (RCI 3.19) and untarred road with potholes (RCI 3.04). Intensity in the use of land (3.41), urbanization and increase in population (3.26) were perceived to be the major factors responsible for spatial expansion and encroachment into the surrounding agricultural lands. The imageries revealed the total land area to be 847.91sq.km. The total built-up area in 1986, 2002 and 2010 are 12.92sq.km, 20.14sq.km and 21.67sq.km respectively. However, the built-up area experienced an increase of 7.22sq.km between 1986 and 2002 and 1.53sq.km between 2002 and 2010. The study therefore recommends the use of housing schemes, afforestation, and relevant planning policies that will protect nature and prevent incursion into agricultural lands. This will prevent haphazard development and consequently promote harmonious land use and sustainable environment.

DEVELOPMENT OF WATER QUALITY INDEX FOR CHANCHAGA RIVER

Ensuring good health status of our water systems is one major way to having sustainable environment. The use of a water-quality index allows for the state of a water-system to be quantified by reducing a large quantity of data on a range of physicochemical and biological variables to a single number that gives reflection of all the variables. The aim of this study is to develop an overall index of water quality for river Chanchaga and its application for water quality evaluation. Water samples were collected and analysed for physicochemical and biological parameters. The analytical results obtained were used as the raw data for the indices. Two approaches were adopted for the determination of the Water Quality Index (WQI), the modified Delphi method and Principal Component Analysis (PCA). For the modified Delphi method, knowledge based experts were developed for proper assessment. The PCA was used to categorize water quality parameters into "organics", "particulate", and "micro-organism" parameters and the structured matrix extracted was used for River Status Index calculation (RSI). The high loading of DO, pH, and Nitrates on the first component (43.58 %) indicate that the water quality is highly influenced by organics variables. The WQI result obtained shows that the water quality of river chanchaga falls in the class of "medium" (WQI= 69.55) and the RSI value (1.37) for the river signified that the river water quality falls in the oligo-trophic rank according to trophic level classification. Thus, the river water can be used for all purposes including drinking but after conventional treatment.
