VIO SENSITISES FUT, MINNA STAFF ON ROAD SAFETY.

The Vice-Chancellor, of the institution, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji *FNSBMB*, has implored the Vehicle Inspection Office (VIO) to regularly organise enlightenment training for the public on the use of road codes to minimise road crashes.

The Vice-Chancellor made the call while speaking at a One-Day public enlightenment training titled: "Safety Rules, Procedure for New Drivers' License, Number Plate & Highway Codes." organised for members of the University staff by Vehicle Inspection Office (VIO), Minna, Niger State on Wednesday, August 28, 2013 at New Agric Lecture Theatre, SAAT, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano. Prof. Akanji commended the Director, VIO Mal. Umaru Mohammed Kuki for his thought provoking sensitization lecture and urged him to pursue\enforce legislation criminalising postage of political campaign posters on road signs.

Given the large turnout of staff at the lecture, the VC promised that the University management would be encouraged to always organise lectures on matters that border on disaster management and risk mitigation.

The guest speaker, Director VIO said the essence of the training was to educate the participants on road regulations and their implications in relation to safety of lives and property.

Mal. Kuki who dwelled extensively on the procedures of obtaining and renewal of the new drivers' license, vehicle number plate and road codes added that everybody is a stakeholder and potential victim of road accident. He described road accident as patient, powerful and uncompromising that when it occurs could either be minor, serious or fatal according to ones luck. The Director who added that road accidents claim more lives than HIV/AIDS in Nigeria said accidents don't just occur but as a result of decisions/actions we take or refuse to take.

The Niger State VIO supremo further stated that road codes are classified into four categories namely; warning, mandatory, informative and prohibition.

Speaking earlier, the Director of Works and Maintenance, Mallam Mahammadu Wuna advised the participants to pay rapt attention to the lecture and thanked the University management for approving the lecture.
