PRESIDENT BUHARI TASKS FUTMINNA GRADUATES ON PEACE, UNITY . . . As Gov. Bello Calls For Collaboration

President Muhammadu Buhari has urged new graduates of the Federal University of Technology, Minna to be committed to a peaceful and united Nigeria.

The President who is also the Visitor to the University stated this while delivering an address at the 25th Convocation Ceremony of the University on Saturday, February 27, 2016.

His words: "Despite the differences in tribe and religion, you schooled together, lived together, dined together and played together. I therefore urge you to sustain the friendships and links that you have established here. It is good for you; it is good for our country." The President disclosed.

President Buhari urged the youth to seek education for personal and socio-economic development, not merely for the sake of feeling better than those who do not have such certificates, pointed out that education would be meaningless if it does not advance the cause of humanity.

He also called on them to see their certificates, not just as meal tickets but as testimony to their character and ability to make society a better place.

Represented by the Director, Technology and Science Education, Federal Ministry of Education, Mr. Sandy Gandy Chega, the President assured that his government wants to build a just society "where citizens with competencies would be proud of themselves and their country, can attain greater heights because of what they know and deliver, not because of who they know or whose

children they are."

He commended FUT, Minna for being the first public university in Nigeria to establish a full-fledged school of entrepreneurship studies and urged the University to ensure that the training is more practical than theoretical.

In his goodwill message, Niger State Governor, Alh. Abubakar Sani Bello congratulated the Vice-Chancellor for sustaining the culture of qualitative education in the University.

He stressed the need for collaborations between institutions of higher learning and the host communities in order to create direct use for research findings.

Gov. Bello stated that his administration is desirous of collaborating with FUT, Minna in enhancing the vast agricultural and solid minerals development in the state, adding that the value chain has the potential to contribute immensely in alleviating poverty through job creation for the teeming youth in the state.

The Convocation also witnessed the investiture and conferment of Doctor of Science degree (*Honoris Causa*) on the new Chancellor of the University, HRM Eze Eberechi Dick (JP), Eze Udo 1 of Mgboko Ngwa Amaise Autonomous Community and Chairman, Abia State and Southeast Council of Traditional Rulers.

In an address shortly after his investiture, Eze Eberechi Dick expressed gratitude to the Federal Government for appointing him as Chancellor of the University and said the appointment would afford him the opportunity to impact positively on the academic excellence and infrastructural development of the University.

The Chancellor who noted that the institution has remained committed to its mandate, commended the Governing Council and the Management for the smooth running of the University, which has ensured that it is devoid of rancour and social vices.

On his part, Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the University Governing Council, Prof. Rufa'i Ahmed Alkali commended the graduands for their perseverance in overcoming academic rigours in the University.

Prof. Alkali said that opportunities and challenges await them in the world ahead maintained that the training they received from the University offers them unique abilities and capacities to face the challenges of contemporary life.

FUTMINNA INTRODUCES FINAL YEAR RESEARCH COMPETITION

In an effort to sustain its reputation as a leading research university, the Federal University of Technology, Minna is instituting an annual school-wide research competition among final year students.

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, **FNSBMB**, who disclosed this in an address he delivered at the 25th convocation ceremony of the University on Saturday, February 27, 2016 said the competition will start this session.

In the address titled "Keeping faith with our vision," Prof. Akanji said that the institution is ensuring that all her final year students target their individual projects at solving particular human problems, a move he expressed belief would further help to identify budding inventors among them.

He noted that FUT, Minna staff led the pack in Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) Institution-based Research Intervention Grant and research proposal submitted to the National Communications Commission (NCC) as six out of the 13 proposals selected by the latter came from the University.

The Vice-Chancellor expressed the belief that no matter the path FUT, Minna graduates choose, the University's degree would be deployed to make the world a better place for humanity.

Prof. Akanji said that the University is committed to promoting academic excellence through autonomous intellectual rigour as well as sustained collaboration and partnerships.

He prayed God to give the new graduates direction, purpose and perseverance.

A total of 3,459 students graduated, out of which 2,741 obtained first degrees, 220 post graduate diplomas, 464 Masters degrees and 34 Doctorate degrees. In all, 32 bagged First Class, 707 Second Class Upper Division, 1,290 Second Class Lower Division, 638 Third Class while 74 got Pass degrees.

POSITIVE OBSERVATIONS AS COREN VISITS FUTMINNA

An accreditation team from the Council for the Regulation of Engineering (COREN) was in the University from Monday, February 29 to Wednesday, March 2, 2016 on accreditation visit for programmes in the School of Engineering and Engineering

accreditation.

Addressing the University Management in an exit visit, at the Council Chamber, Main Campus, leader of the accreditation team, Engr. Sunday Umana, said commended the University for the acquisition of many new equipment even as he expressed satisfaction with the staff development programme of the University.

He said that the capacity of the University's Central Library is in order, adding that they were impressed with the e-library and urged for maintenance of the standard.

He also noted that the University adheres strictly to its admission policy, just as external examiners that SEET uses are COREN-registered professors and senior lecturers

They also commended the team spirit among staff of SEET, among other things.

The accreditation team, however, identified areas for improvement.

In his response, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewunmi Akanji, **FNSBMB**, thanked them for their detailed observations and assured that the University would take steps to address the observations made by the team.

A detailed report from COREN would be conveyed to the Vice-Chancellor after approval of its Council.

A STRONG GOVT NEEDED TO ACHIEVE SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC GROWTH IN NIGERIA - PROF ADEOTI

Rather than making sustained economic progress, Nigeria's economic fortunes of the 1960s/1970s only lasted till the 1980s when there was a sharp and persistent decline in the international price of crude oil.

Professor John Adeoti stated this when he delivered the 25th Convocation Lecture of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, titled: **"Universities and the Challenge of Tackling Innovation Deficit in Nigeria"** on Friday, February 26, 2016 at the Caverton Lecture Hall, School of Agriculture and Agricultural Technology (SAAT), Main Campus, Gidan Kwano.

Prof. Adeoti said that Nigeria though young in democratic governance experience needs a strong government to achieve sustainable economic growth that is truly poverty reducing, job creating and environment protecting, adding that realizing these key aspects of development is dependent on Nigeria's capacity to tackle innovation deficit because development is not possible without an innovation-driven economy.

The Professor of Development Economics at the Nigerian Institute of Social and Economic Research (NISER), said that universities also have a role to play in tackling the innovation deficit through research and development, noting that the current nature of research and training presently offered by Nigerian universities is limited in its developmental focus and also lacking in entrepreneurial

orientation.

The Don further tasked the government to improve the quality of graduates by fostering a stronger collaboration of universities with industries by establishing a consultative process whereby the opinion of relevant business managers is considered in curriculum development, so that teaching and research - industry collaborative progress can better respond to industry's needs.

According to him, the key actor in such a government must eschew self-interest and make public interest the sole driver of public policy choices and implementation of development projects and programmes by which their common goal should be banishing underdevelopment from our society.

Speaking further, Prof. Adeoti said government must recognize the critical role of technological innovation in economic development and be committed to making the instrument of state work for technology acquisition and innovation in every sector of the economy.

He admonished the universities, particularly FUT, Minna to immediately take the lead in the advocacy for tackling innovation deficit in Nigeria.

Earlier the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, **FNSBMB**, while introducing the speaker said the need for the topic on economic development was borne out of the fact that the economy lacks technological innovation which is needed to see a rapid growth for the Nigerian economy and that the lecture is a wake up call to make the University contribute its own quota to the challenge of tackling innovation deficit in Nigeria through research and development.

In his remark at the event, the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council, Prof. Rufa'i Ahmed Alkali congratulated the Vice-Chancellor and Management for organizing an excellent Convocation Lecture.

He admonished the University to look into ways which they can impact on the economy through technological research and development instead of waiting for the government.

PROF MORENIKEJI IS NEW DVC ACADEMIC

The Governing Council of the Federal University of Technology, Minna has approved the appointment of Prof. Oluwole Olanmi Morenikeji of the Department of Urban and Regional Planning (URP), School of Environmental Technology (SET) as the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic).

In a letter conveying the appointment, the Registrar, Mrs. Victoria Nnawo Kolo, stated that Council approved the appointment at its 116th Meeting held on

Wednesday, February 24, 2016.

The appointment which is for a period of two years in the first instance takes effect on Monday, March 7, 2016.

Born in Ibadan, Oyo State on May 14, 1962. Morenikeji had his primary education at St. Peter's Primary School, Aremo, Ibadan from 1968 to 1973. He attended Ibadan Christ Apostolic Grammar School, Aperin - Oniyere, Ibadan from 1974 to 1979. From 1979 to 1983, he was at the University of Calabar where he obtained his B.Sc. in Geography and Regional Planning and between 1986 - 1988 pursued his M.Sc. Urban and Regional Planning Studies at the University of Benin.

Prof. Morenikeji enrolled for his Ph.D in the Department of Geography, FUT, Minna on part time basis in 1992, in the course of which he secured a Nigerian - Italian Scholarship, which enabled him to do part of his Ph.D at the University of Trieste, Italy on split - site basis. He bagged his Ph.D in Transportation Planning in 1998.

He joined the services of the Federal University of Technology, Minna in 1990 as an Assistant Lecturer and steadily rose through the ranks to become the first alumnus of the University to become a professor in 2006.

He has held many positions within and outside the University among which are; pioneering Head of Department, URP, Deputy Director of the Centre for Human Settlements and Urban Development (CHSUD), University's pioneering SERVICOM Vocal Officer, Dean, School of Environmental Technology, a position he held simultaneously with that of Coordinator of the New School of Entrepreneurship and Management Technology, Chairman, University Anti-Plagiarism Committee and Web Content Committee and member of the Governing Council from 2008 - 2012.

A man of innovations, his thoughtful memos to the University Management contributed to the Anti-plagiarism Policy which brought the University into limelight as the first public university in Nigeria to implement the use of Turnitin Anti-plagiarism Software and its being awarded the Academic Integrity Certification in 2013.

At the national level, Prof. Morenikeji served as the Alternate Secretary for Urban and Rural Development Thematic Area of the Vision 20: 2020 and also the Returning Officer for the Niger East Senatorial Election.

A well-published scholar, the new DVC (Academic) has supervised 10 Ph.D and over 20 M.Tech and PGD students.

He is a member of the Nigerian Institute of Town Planners and a Registered Member of the Town Planners Registration Council (TOPREC).

He is happily married with children.

FUTMINNA RESEARCHERS TO PARTICIPATE @ 2016 NURESDEF

Barring any last minute change of plans, researchers from the Federal University of Technology, Minna will participate in the forthcoming 6th edition of the Nigerian Universities Research and Development Fair (NURESDEF) holding at the Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka, Anambra State from March 7-12, 2016.

This disclosure was made by the Director, Directorate for Research, Innovations and Development (**DRID**) of the University, Prof. Hussieni Anthony Makun during an exclusive interview with Campus News in his office at the Senate Building today.

Prof. Makun stated that 37 research projects with 16 researchers would represent the University with the aim of winning the overall prize at the event, adding that all the projects to be exhibited at the Fair has undergone intense scrutiny by the Directorate's Research, projects and Appraisal Committee towards ensuring that the University presents its best research works at the event.

He pointed out that the 25th Convocation Exhibition was a dress rehearsal for NURESDEF owing to the fact that some quality projects were discovered during the exhibition and have been added to the projects to be displayed at the biennial event.

The Director expressed optimism that the University would retain the first position it won at the last edition

based on the quality of projects assembled for the event while noting that the University has recorded remarkable improvements in the areas of research, innovations and development under the present administration.

He disclosed that the University has attracted national research fund to the tune of N14.5m and has accessed all its institutional based research grants worthy N20m every year, stating that the University researchers have been exposed to the nitty-gritty of research proposal writing with collaborators outside the country.

"We are doing very well in research, last year we won all the three categories of research grants organized by the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC) and we swept TETFund institutional research grants", he enthused.

On the level of support enjoyed from the University Management, the Director commended the University Management for stimulating quality research in the institution through its proposal to the University Senate that changed the name of the University Board of Research to Directorate for Research, Innovations and Development (DRID), approval of the University research, policy and strategy document and for constituting a committee on Intellectual Property Right chaired by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Abdullahi Bala.

The theme for this year NURESDEF is "Research and Innovation: A panacea to National Industrial Transformation".

The fair is planned to provide a platform for Nigerian Universities to showcase their achievements and development oriented research projects and programmes and also to encourage industries to sponsor research works in Nigeria Universities for commercial purposes.

The fair also aims to promote collaborations among researchers from different universities and linkages with industries and international organizations.

It will be recalled that the Federal University of Technology, Minna hosted and won the 5th edition of NURESDEF in 2012.
