FUTMINNA HOLDS 2-DAY RETREAT

In line with its drive towards attaining world class status and keeping faith with the dreams of its founding fathers in accordance with its mission and vision, the Federal University of Technology, Minna had a two-day Retreat on Presentation of Reports of Transitional Committees.

The retreat, held on Monday 13th and Tuesday 14th August, 2018 at the Chemical Engineering Lecture theatre, had the presence of about 158 participants drawn from various Departments, Units and Centres of the University.

In a brief presentation titled: Taking Federal University of Technology Minna to the Next Level, the Vice-Chancellor Prof. Abdullahi Bala, *fssn*, said the University's core value is commitment to global best practices which encompasses excellence, innovation or creativity and entrepreneurship. Others are inclusiveness/equity, responsiveness as well as timeliness and integrity.

The helmsman continued with a charge on revenue generation strategies where, he said, the existing sources could be enhanced and leakages blocked, including investments in the commercial farm and FUTMIN Ventures. Another area of income generation to be looked into, he stated, is the Advancement office that comprises alumni, endowments and donations.

"There are five transition committees namely Revenue Generation and Entrepreneurship; Campus-Community Relations and Infrastructure. Others are Development of Technology and Students/Alumni Support Service," he revealed.

Thereafter each of the committees made presentations and recommendations in accordance with their terms of reference. Their recommendations are in line with global best practices that need to be inculcated in the day-to-day management of the University.

After extensive deliberations, a communique was issued at the end of the retreat where participants noted that there is paucity of funds to execute most needs of the University as well as inadequate power supply and IT infrastructure to support the University activities.

Participants also called on the University to entrench entrepreneurial culture, build business capacity and attraction of funding support for students as well as

making the University policies to support students-industry collaboration and work-study programmes among others.

The communique further advised that there should be massive deployment of modern technology in teaching and learning and also provide incentives in interdisciplinary researches in core development areas including research industry collaboration.

Speaking further in his closing remarks, Prof. Bala assured that all that was discussed would not remain on paper as Management intends to implement them.

"We may not be able achieve all that was discussed but we would make sure we achieve essential part of it so that we lay a solid foundation so that others would continue from where we stop," he concluded.

Earlier in his remarks the Adjunct Prof., from Illinois State University, Prof. Chika Nnamani, who has visited various campuses in the world to participate in similar retreat, commended the intellectual power of the University and for taking giant stride on the path of excellence. He admired the commitment and the robust nature of the debates which he said was very encouraging.

"The intellectual will power of this campus is amazing. I commend the Vice-Chancellor for creating such an environment where people are committed to making the system first to be reckoned with in the world. Hardly in any system do people who are working diligently like you not know what is wrong with the system, I commend you for speaking out. You have done the hard part the easy part is to begin and be committed," he charged.

He described the achievements of the exercise as collective effort while calling on all to trust the system.

In his vote of thanks the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Yahaya Iyaka thanked the Vice-Chancellor for the initiative, the drive and leadership. He also thanked the transitional committee members for working assiduously to make the retreat happen. Prof. Iyaka thanked the Adjunct Prof., the Registrar and his team as well as everyone for their time and patience while wishing them journey mercies to their various destinations.

ARMED FORCES SIMULATION CENTRE SEEKS COLLABORATION WITH FUTMINNA

The Armed Forces Simulation Centre (AFSC), has requested for a collaboration with the Federal University of Technology, Minna, towards development of a Joint Conflicts and Tactical Simulation Software (JCATS).

This was made known on Thursday, August 16, 2018 at the Vice-Chancellor's Office, Main Campus.

The AFSC team, which was led by Col. Salisu Ibrahim said AFSC is a Military Unit under the Defence Headquarters and the primary responsibility of the centre is to conduct simulation exercise for the military, police, as well as other security and emergency response organisations.

He said, the software in use at the AFSC is the Joint Conflicts and Tactical Simulation Software (JCATS), which was developed by Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL) of the USA, like most Simulation Software, the JCATS requires upgrade whenever a new version of the software is released. But unfortunately, due to certain diplomatic bottlenecks, the AFSC has not been able to regularly upgrade the software as required. This has not only impacted negatively on the conduct of simulation exercise at the centre but has affected its ability to collaborate with other simulation centres for effective training.

He stated that in a bid to find a suitable and sustainable alternative for the JCATS, it was suggested that AFSC could collaborate with a reputable institution in the country towards the development of a software centre and that after due consultations, FUT, Minna was identified based on its track records as having the capacity to collaborate with AFSC, hence, the request to collaborate with the institution toward the development of the software.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, *fssn*, acknowledged the interest shown and said that as a University of technology, the institution was established primarily to put to effect the nations desire for self reliance in science and technology, adding that every segment of the society that requires technology to carry out its mandate, FUT, Minna is always willing and eager to provide support as well as expertise to fosters that aspiration.

He pointed out that the University has a range of expertise in the area of artificial intelligence, Cyber Security and be able to partners AFSC in developing something that can be truly considered as a local and home based technology.

The AFSC officials were later taken on a tour of facilities in the University, where they also had an interactive session with scientists.

Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for admission into the One-year Preliminary Degree programme for the 2018/2019 academic session for both Minna and Suleja Centres and IJMB 2019/2020 academic session (Minna Centre only) of the Federal University of Technology, Minna. Entry Requirements:

To qualify for admission, a candidate MUST have at least five (5) credits including **English Language, Mathematics** and in any three of the following subjects: **Physics, Chemistry, Economics, Biology/ Agricultural Science/Health Science/ Technical Drawing and Geography at SSCE, GCE O' Level, NECO and NABTEB**. The results obtained should not be at more than two sittings. For IJMB programme, Agricultural Science and Health Science are not acceptable.

Application form costs **Five Thousand Naira (₦5,000.00)** only.

- (a) Pre-degree 16th July – 30th September, 2018
(b) IJMB 16th July – 30th November, 2018

Method of Application:

Candidates are to log on to (www.futminna.edu.ng) to obtain instructions for the purchase of application forms. Please note that the Centre is not liable to give reasons for rejecting any application, nor will it enter into correspondence on the subject matter with any applicant.

This is to inform all candidates who have applied for admission into the Federal University of Technology, Minna for the 2018/2019 academic session that the University's Pre-Admission Screening Exercise (UPASE) will hold at the University Main Campus, Gidan Kwano, Minna as follows:

- (i) **Unified Tertiary & Matriculation Examination (UTME)** - Monday, 3rd to Thursday, 6th September, 2018
(ii) **Direct Entry (DE)** - Friday, 7th to Saturday, 8th September, 2018

Note: The screening exercise will be conducted using Computer Based-Test (CBT) platform.

Candidates awaiting "O" level results are not qualified for the screening exercise.

REGISTRATION:

Registration for **UTME and DE** candidates will commence on **Wednesday, 15th August, 2018** and end midnight of **Friday, 31st August, 2018**.

Candidates are advised to visit the FUT Minna website: www.futminna.edu.ng for details on the procedure for on-line registration, requirements for the screening exercise, procedure for payment and other general information.

Candidates are to pay a non-refundable fee of **Two thousand Naira (N2,000)** only (i.e. **One thousand Naira (N1,000.00)** only for the Computer Based Test (CBT) and **One thousand Naira (N1,000.00)** only as University Processing Fee through REMITA platform.

ELIGIBILITY:

- (i) Only UTME and DE candidates who selected Federal University of Technology, Minna as first choice are eligible for the screening exercise.
- (ii) UTME candidates must have a minimum UTME score of 180, except for those courses for which higher cut-off marks have been indicated on the University website.
- (iii) All candidates must possess a minimum of five 'O' level credits including Mathematics and English Language at not **more than two sittings** in subjects relevant to their proposed courses. In addition, DE candidates must possess a minimum of **Lower Credit** at National Diploma and/or Higher National Diploma or Merit at NCE.
- (iv) UTME candidates that have met the minimum score of their chosen courses, but do not have the UTME or O'level subjects combination are eligible to change to any other course that its requirements are met by the candidates.
- (v) Only 'O' level result print-out(s) downloaded directly from the website(s) of the National Examining Bodies (WAEC/NECO/NABTEB) or photocopies of original certificate(s) will be accepted for verification.
