#### **NATURAL MEDICINE DEVELOPMENT:** FUTMINNA, AGENCY RENEW MOU

he Federal University of Technology, Minna and the Nigeria Natural Medicine Development Agency (NNMDA) on Tuesday, November 13, 2018 renewed their Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), in an effort to promote cooperation in staff training, research and product development.

In his remarks at the event which took place at the Federal Ministry of Science and Technology, Abuja, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof. Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, described the agreement as a sign of good things to come, adding that re-signing the document was an opportunity to solidify the relationship between both institutions.

Prof. Bala stressed the need to review the progress that has so far been made under the first MOU signed in 2011 that saw to the establishment of a medicinal farm in the University. He said the farm is a veritable opportunity to move the relationship forward.

Pointing out that much is being said about natural medicine in the society without the corresponding will to go the extra mile about it, he expressed commitment to the success of the collaboration.

In his remarks, the Director General of NNMDA, Dr. Samuel Etatuvie said the Agency holds FUT, Minna in high esteem. He commended the University for sustaining interest in the collaboration, noting that a lot of benefits would accrue to both parties if they stick faithfully to the MOU.

Dr. Etatuvie disclosed that approval had been given for the resuscitation of the Agency's College of Natural Medicine Technology and expressed hope to collaborate with the University in that regard.

He assured that the Agency intends to resume work soon at the demonstration farm in the University, adding that the Federal Ministry of Science and Technology was keen on product development.

Speaking earlier, Dean, School of Life Sciences, Prof. Emmanuel Ogbadoyi, disclosed that the collaboration between FUT, Minna and the Agency was conceived with the thinking that such would do a lot of good for the country.

He recalled that under the previous agreement, the University had allocated a 10-hectare land for the cultivation of medicinal and aromatic plants at the Gidan Kwano campus, while NNMDA funded a study of the soil type, which was undertaken by the Department of Soil Science and Land Management in the University, to determine which plants would be suitable there.

Prof. Ogbadoyi expressed hope that with the renewal of the MOU, more would be done in actualising the terms of the agreement, especially the training and product development components.

The MOU includes research collaboration in making natural products, natural medicine, traditional medicine, science and engineering as well as agricultural practices. It also covers joint programme development and exchange of technical visits.

Both parties are also to work together in the aspects of diagnostics, novel drugs, biotechnology, nanotechnology in medicine, bioinformatics and synthetic biology, among other things.



# VC HARPS ON SYNERGY BETWEEN FUTMINNA, NIGER STATE

#### As FUT, Minna Signs MoU With Urban Shelter Ltd

he Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology Minna, Prof Abdullahi Bala, fsssn, has called on Nigerlites to invest in the institution

The Vice-Chancellor made this known yesterday at the VC's Conference Room, Main Campus when signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Urban Shelter Infrastructure Ltd, Abuja.

Speaking during the signing, the VC said the essence of having a Federal University in our community is for us to own it because it is the interest of the community that the university should be seen to be serving, adding that there is a very close engagement between the University and that of community therefore leaders in the state in his opinion are to find out how FUTMinna, which has all kinds of expertise can help the community.

Prof. Bala congratulated the Chairman of Urban Shelter, Mallam Ibrahim Aliyu for his commitment to education and the University, pointing out that they are the first indigenous developers to FUTMinna and about the only personality from Niger State that found it fit to donate an edifice on Build, Operate and Transfer (BOT) basis to the University some years back, adding that for this reason, it came natural to accept their proposal to build hostel for the University not just because they are a leading company in estate development.

The helmsman expressed Managements appreciation to Urban Shelter for the honour accorded the University, adding that he has no doubt it will be successful.

He noted that the Chairman of Urban Shelter is a son of the soil and he is the only one that has found it worthy to look at the University as a partner and hopes that the gesture will show other Nigerlites that they can come and partner and invest in the University, adding that if this works, he believes that more will come and invest in the University.

He revealed that Urban Shelter has also given a commitment to build a guest house later. The VC appreciated Urban Shelter for their gradual investment in infrastructure that would make the University to become a living environment not just for lectures.

The VC pointed out that student accommodation has been a concern as the University has over 22 thousand students but has provision for less than five thousand bed space, adding that he aspires to have as much as 75% of students on campus which he said will expose the students to the life of students in campus and also avail the opportunity for mentorship of the students and wants a case where students will live off campus out of choice not out of necessity.

In his remark, the MD, Urban Shelter Infrastructure Ltd, Rilwan Salihu Aliyu who was representing the Chairman disclosed that the Chairman is passionate in helping to restore every aspect of education and both of them being alumni of the University know the importance of hostels, so they see working for the FUT as home.

He assured Management of a thorough job, adding that they will ensure the edifice is not just beautiful but functional.

Mal. Aliyu explained that they plan to built four clusters of hostels containing three blocks of 448 unit each, 1344 in a cluster, totaling 5376 and intend to start the 1st cluster in December.

Other areas covered by the MoU are the project will be under a Build, Operate and Transfer arrangement to cater for 5376 students, which shall contain a maximum of eight students per room with each student's annual rent charge of N70,000.00 to be completed within a period of 60 months.

## FUTMINNA TO PARTNER ENTRUST MICROGRID

he Federal University of Technology, Minna, is to partner with Entrust Microgrid, Lancaster, UK in the area of renewable energy and training. This was brought to the fore when the founder Entrust Microgrid, Prof. Xiongwei Liu along with his team paid a courtesy call on the University.

Speaking at the event on Thursday, November 15, 2018 at the Main Campus, the founder, Prof. Liu said Microgrid which is already gaining ground in the United Kingdom is a direct current/alternative current network for built environment with embedded solar photovoltaic panels, energy storage, direct current loads and electric vehicle charges connected to the direct current chargers.

He said to him, air-conditions, refrigerators, water pumping machines and electrical vehicles can be powered direct from renewable power at over 98.6%, adding that it is very suitable for Nigeria and Africa at large for its efficiency, less need for large scale infrastructure or expensive grid connectivity.

Prof. Liu said they were in the University to check the facilities of the institution with the hope of partnering with FUTMinna so as to finalise the documentation process of the United Kingdom (UK) energy catalyst Round 6 competition.

According to him, the intention of Entrust is to provide training platform empowerment for students which is absolutely critical not just for academic purpose but for commercial purpose to empower them.

He disclosed that they plan to set up a power plant in Nigeria.

In his response, the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof Abdullahi Bala, *fsssn*, welcomed the team and appreciated them for having FUTMinna in mind. He noted that he is happy with the partnership because it is in line with the University's aspiration and their visit is an opportunity for the institution to scale up its capacity in the area of renewable energy, adding that the University is into similar partnership in the area of agriculture.

Prof. Bala pointed out that his interest is largely in the fact that students are involved, which would provide them first class practical experience that allows them to start on their own after graduation.

"To us, that is the pride that we are in the position to provide students such opportunities that makes them more competitive," he said.

He noted that in the last one week the employment ranking of universities ranked FUT, Minna as number four in Nigeria in terms of employable graduates and that this is because of the premium placed in providing students with practical experience.
