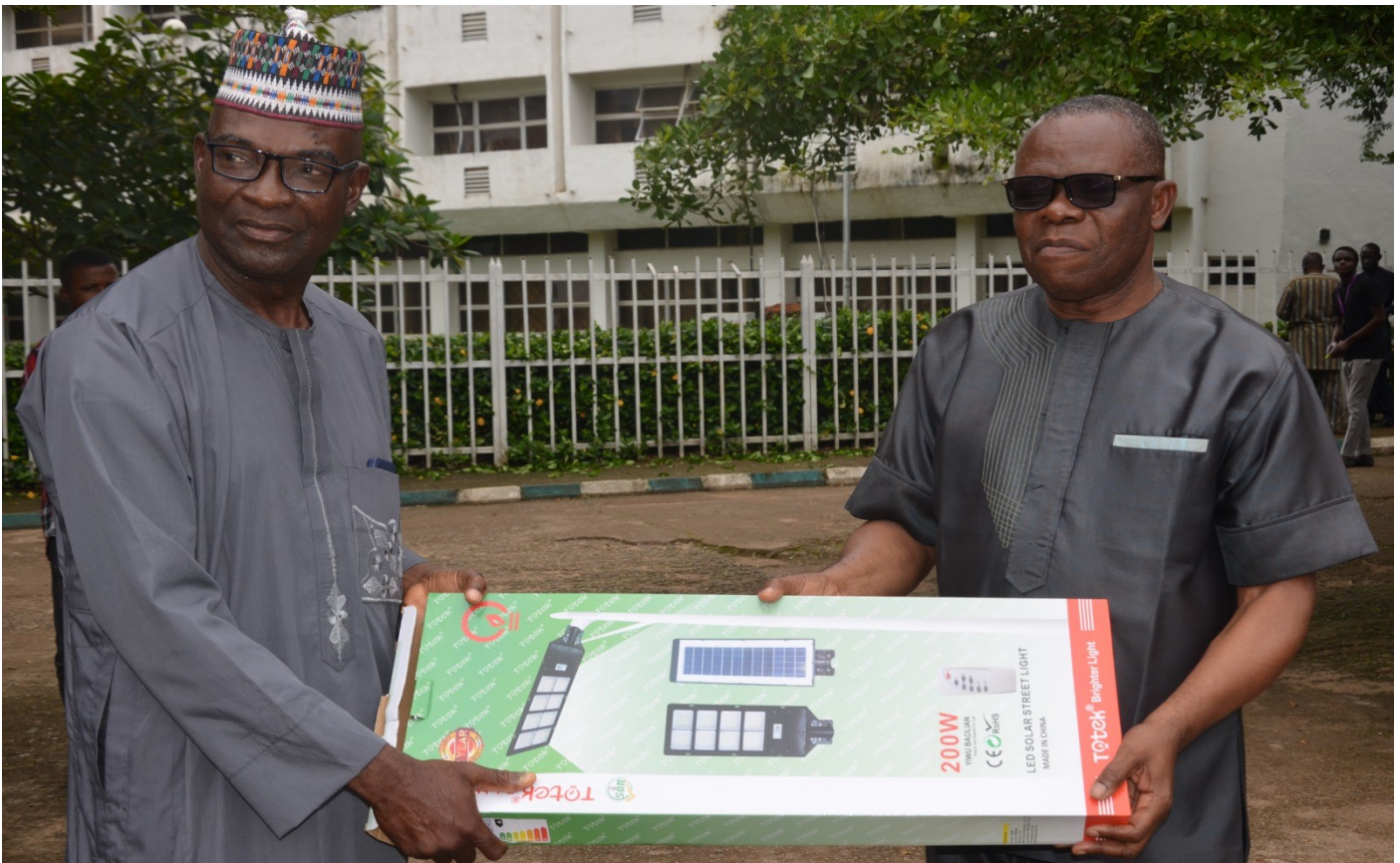

The Executive Director, Planning and Design, Upper Niger River Basin Development Authority (UNRBDA), Engr. Suleiman Mohammed has made a personal donation of ten Solar Street lights to the Federal University of Technology, Minna.

Presenting the items on Thursday, August 24, 2023 at the Senate Building Car Park, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano, the representative of the Executive Director, Engr. Muhammed Aliyu accompanied by QS. Adamu Hussain said the solar street lights, powered by solar energy are meant for students' hostels and staff quarters to alleviate the problem of power failure on Campus. "By next week the poles will be ready and the installation will commence immediately", he added.

He also disclosed that to ease water problem, Upper Niger River Basin Development Authority

(UNRBDA) plans to sink three bore holes in the University as captured in its 2024 budget.

Receiving the items on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Faruk Adamu Kuta, the Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Administration, Prof. Uno E. Uno said the Management Staff and Students are very grateful to the Executive Director, Upper Niger River Basin Development Authority (UNRBDA) for this generous donation and pray this partnership gets stronger and better.

Speaking earlier the Head of Department, Project Management, FUT Minna, Dr. Chinedu C. Adindu who said before he joined the University, he was consultant to many industries, stated that the gesture is part of the assurance he gave the Vice-Chancellor to partner in respect to capacity building and development using his contact and link in the industries.

- Students should not be allowed to bring already decided project topics; rather lecturers should work with students to decide on their topics which should, as far as possible, be in the areas of interest to the students.
- Library should be well equipped to aid students in project writing.
