he Federal University of Technology, Minna has won a two hundred and fifty million naira (N250, 000.00) Abdul Samad Rabiu Initiative (ASR Africa) Tertiary Education Grant 2022.

Managing Director/ Chief Executive Officer of ASR Africa, Dr. Udoh Ubon who spoke briefly during the formal presentation of the award letter on Thursday, February 9, 2023 in Abuja disclosed that the University was included in the awards in recognition of its ranking, service delivery, development and quality of its leadership, graduates.

congratulated University's He the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Faruk Adamu Kuta for the award.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor thanked ASR Africa for the philanthropic gesture. He disclosed that Management had resolved that the grant would be channelled into building a student hostel, given hostel the paucity accommodation on campus.

Prof. Kuta further disclosed that, presently, less

than 4, 000 out of the student population of over 26, 000 are accommodated in the hostels, adding that the institution seeks to accommodate, at least, 50 percent of its students on campus.

The ASR Africa Tertiary Education Grant Scheme is part of efforts of the Chairman of BUA Group, Alh. Abdul Samad Rabiu, to give back to the African continent and make lasting impact on education, as a means of uplifting and restoring the dignity and lives of Africans.

It is a \$100-million annual fund for social development and renewal, with education, health and social development as focal areas. Out of the amount \$50 million is devoted to interventions in Nigeria while the other half is for the rest of the continent.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE IS NOT A TRIAL PRACTICE- PROF. KEMIKI

rof. Olurotimi Adebowale Kemiki of the Department of Estate Management and Valuation, Federal University Technology Minna has said that unless property maintenance practices in country are strictly handled by experts in Estate Management and Valuation, achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) remains a mirage as property maintenance is not a trial and error practice.

He stated this while delivering the 103th inaugural Lecture of the University titled "Property Value-What is Behind Six is More Than Seven," on Wednesday, 2023 at the University February 8, Auditorium, Main Campus, Gidan Kwano, Minna.

Prof. Kemiki who further stated that what determines the worth of property is beyond finances, described physical and involvement of some individuals from other disciplines in the activities of property management and valuation as an abuse of

He emphasized power. that the only professionals exclusively with the right to place value on anything are the estate surveyors and valuers as enshrined in the constitution.

The Inaugural Lecturer also highlighted environmental disamenity resulting from poor infrastructure, poor municipal solid waste disposal, lack of potable water supply and industrial activities among others as some of the factors responsible for the unwarranted devaluation of properties especially in the urban areas.

He further listed some of the vital roles played estate surveyors in ensuring proper management and utilization of property to include provision of appropriate and accurate estimation of land and property values to proffer public authorities with adequate rates to be charged on properties during compensation and revenue generation, determination of best use of location to avoid citing properties in an incompatible location.

Other roles include development of land information and management system for the purpose of housing provision scheme as well as arbitration and conciliation consultants for settlement of land disputes arising from unlawful possession, trespasses and illegal property transactions.

The don also appealed to leaders in both public and private sectors to always appoint estate surveyors and valuers as heads of maintenance units in their respective organizations in order to avert institutional failure.

"Estate surveyors and valuers should be accorded relevant recognition in infrastructural development and management in Nigeria." Prof. Kemiki further emphasized.

He also stressed the need for a conscious efforts by the authorities to design policies that will drive and sustain environmental facilities provision and maintenance.

- Plagiarism and cheating in continuous assessment, assignments and exams.
- Inconsistencies and favouritism in grading.

Preventive actions:

- Adopt, publicize and implement codes of conduct for the behaviour for staff and students.
- Inform Students of the sanctions for plagiarism/cheating.
- Ensure security of exam preparation and printing processes.
- Appoint sufficient numbers of invigilators/proctors, conduct identification checks and install CCTV cameras in exam halls.
- Emphasis use of marking scheme and monitor standards of marking.
- Ensure security of student record systems.

The Postgraduate School of Federal University of Technology, Minna hereby inform prospective candidates of the University community and the general public that the sale of online Postgraduate application forms for admission into the 2022/2023 academic session has commenced.

Important Notice:

All applicants must possess the basic entry requirements in addition to five O'level credits in WAEC, NECO, NABTEB, and GCE or their equivalents including English and Mathematics.

Prospective candidates are to visit the Federal University of Technology, website: www.futminna.edu.ng for information requirements, purchase, filling and submission of the online forms.

Application Fee:

University charges an application fee of N15,000.00 (Fifteen Thousand Naira) only plus, N250.00 (Two Hundred and Fifty Naira) only Remita charges making a total of N15,250.00 (Fifteen Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty Naira) only payable online via Remita platform with the use of Master or Verve card through the School portal.

Closing Date:

Completed application forms must be submitted online through the University portal latest on 17th March, 2023. All necessary instructions on filling of forms must be adhered to as failure to do so is sufficient reason to disqualify an applicant.

Payment of Fees and the Procedures

All successful applicants offered provisional admission must pay nonrefundable acceptance fee of N20,000 only and later undergo the following registration formalities: screening of original credentials at Postgraduate School and payment of School fees and registration at Departments/Centres. This shall be completed within a stipulated date, beyond which the candidate loses the admission.




